Pacific Basin Nuclear Conference: Call for Papers *Abstracts due October 31, 2013*

WASHINGTON and BUSAN, KOREA, October 23, 2013 – The Pacific Nuclear Council has issued a call for papers for the 2014 Pacific Basic Nuclear Conference (PBNC-2014), to be held in Vancouver, Canada in August 2014. Abstracts of 150-250 words are due for submission by October 31, 2013.

Authors are encouraged to submit papers on any topic in nuclear technology for oral presentation in technical sessions at PBNC-2014. The theme of PBNC-2014 is “Fulfilling the Promise of Nuclear Technology around the Pacific Basin in the 21st Century.” It has been established to (i) showcase the advancement of nuclear technology in power generation, health science, and environmental stewardship, (ii) discuss challenges facing nuclear technology, and (iii) highlight future development.

PBNC-2014 represents the international segment of nuclear research institutions and operators that ring the Pacific Ocean. Founded in 1976 as a biennial regional cooperative forum to advance peaceful uses of nuclear energy in the Pacific Basin region, PBNC-2014 will convene for the 19th time next year. The Canadian Nuclear Society, the Canadian Nuclear Association and Natural Resources Canada are proud to host the conference in Vancouver, Canada, under the aegis of the Pacific Nuclear Council.
